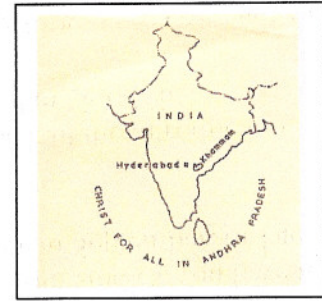

Dear Students of The Firs School,

Please find enclosed letters from two of the children you have so generously been sponsoring. Upendra and Ramesh have now passed their 10th Class exams, and will go on to study further or to work to support their families. They have moved away from the Gollpapudi hostels, but will never forget the love and support they received their since they were young children. Please pray for them as they move forward in their lives.

In place of these two young people, I have matched you with two new boys to the hostel, Pramod Bhukya and Radha Krishna Nagisetty. I enclose introduction cards for them, together with a letter they have written for you. I hope that you will be pleased to sponsor these boys, who are aged 10 and 12. In India, your age doesn't necessarily correspond to your school year, as many children start school later, especially if their families are poor. Also, if you don't do well in your studies, you have to stay back and repeat your year. Their school year starts the same time as ours, in September, or late August.

The reference numbers (234 and 218) for your children are written on the back of the introduction cards; please quote these in any correspondence with myself or our treasurer, Ian Goodwin.

I will try to find out details of your other sponsored children, and if we get any more news from any of them, I'll let you know straight away. In the meantime, please remember in your prayers all of the children you sponsor, and all the others in the hostels. Thank you again for your support.
